Designed for use by geologists when taking samples of rock and fossils in the field, this pick has a large square striking face with an opposing end ground to a point for splitting, cracking and levering.

## LATH HAMMER

This specialist hammer is a traditional tool used by both builders and plasterers. The steel shaft features a comfortable non-slip rubber grip and the axe-shaped head is used for cutting and trimming laths. The head incorporates a notch designed for pulling nails, and the striking face on the opposing end is used for driving nails.

## MORTAR PICKS

A traditional bricklayers tool available in two formats with a double point, or a point and chisel. The hardened point is used for raking out weathered mortar joints and for digging out in clay, shale, sand or chalk, while the chisel end is used for dressing or removing redundant mortar from bricks.
